It has clearly been established at the right time, right place and with the right values.

While on my vacation, I was able to meet and interact with our students and staff at our school. Right from the gate of the school campus where I was jubilantly received, and throughout my interactions, it was very evident that we have a student body that is highly disciplined, highly motivated to learn and very happy and proud of their school. This was expressed both in the songs, dances, and other body gestures they displayed. On account of these characteristics, our school has become the talk of the region and there is great expectation from the community about its performance at the national examinations at the end of this year. I am very convinced that we shall meet or even exceed those expectations.

However, perhaps the greatest highlight of my visit was a dinner I was hosted to by the EENU alumni comprising all our students who were sponsored by E3 Africa and are now working or are married. I was very delighted to hear stories of how, because of the sponsorships they received, they are now successful and able to take care of themselves. Many expressed the determination to give back in gratitude by helping in any way possible, disadvantaged children like themselves. One of the alumni who moved me most was Gladys Anzoyo who was sponsored by Francesca Murphy. Anzoyo is now a distinguished lawyer. In her only three years of legal practice, she is singlehandedly sponsoring the education of five students, three at the university level and two in high school. She is tipped to become a State Attorney, a promotion which, she said, will give her the ability to sponsor more students. I have recently appointed her on the Uganda Board not only to represent the alumni but also to provide legal insights to the board there. Gladys and many of her colleagues are proof of the validity of my vision for founding E3 Africa/EENU which is to "Provide Education to the orphans and poor children of Uganda so that they may be able to help themselves and their community". I am ever grateful to God and to our generous sponsors, donors, boards, and staff for supporting this vision. With your continued support, the sky is just the beginning for these poor children!



OUR LADY OF MT. CARMEL CATHOLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS IN TEMPE ADOPT E3 AFRICA FOR LENTEN MISSION AND SPONSOR 13 STUDENTS

The story of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic School's Lenten project to sponsor impoverished orphans in Uganda is one of hope, compassion, and commitment. When Fr. Robert Aliunzi shared the challenges of day-to-day life in Uganda, the school's principal, Dr. Kelly Shewbridge, vice principal Tony Grosetta, and development director Ashley Hall knew they had to help. Together, they rallied the school community to raise over \$11,000 to support 13 orphans.

The school's commitment didn't end there, however. Each classroom adopted a student and will communicate regularly via letters exchanged, sharing their educational experiences. The children at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic School asked thoughtful questions and felt inspired by the work of E3 Africa and the challenges faced by their Ugandan peers.

The impact of this project will be felt for years to come. Not only will the sponsored children receive vital support, but the students at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Catholic School will learn important lessons about empathy, compassion, and global citizenship. It's a wonderful example of how a small community can make a big difference in the world.

Ellebracht Family donates 25k to further development of St. Thomas Aquinas Demonstration Farm

Steve and Karen Ellebract visited St. Thomas Aquinas School in Moyo, Uganda this past February and were inspired to donate \$25,000 to improve the farming capabilities of the land resources to provide food for the orphaned and poor children who attend and live at the school. The Ellebracht's are committed to ensuring the growth of the farm so that it eventually sustains the nutritional needs of the school children and their families. Long-term, the Ellebracts envision a vocational farming program that will educate students in farming so that they may use the acquired skills to feed the starving families in the region. The land for the farm was donated by E3 Africa's co-founder Rosalie Weller.
